Comments to the Author

This is a very well thought-out article that speaks to both international lawyers and Indonesian lawyers. It traces the changes in the international and domestic legal meaning of resource nationalism. It is well researched brings together a large amount of material. The article, however, could use some stylistic and editorial work.

The strength of the article is the fact that it weaves together so many different types of law – public international, international investment, international arbitration, international human rights, indigenous rights, and Indonesian constitutional law. And the article traces how all of these laws are play out in both international and Indonesian institutions.

There is an incredible amount of detail, and different readers will have different knowledge bases. So, that means the reader needs a light of signposts. The author may want to consider providing clearer statements at the beginning of each section, and throughout the text. Also, it would also help to have better transitions between paragraphs and sections – this will significantly help the reader follow through the entirety of the argument without getting lost in the details.

Reviewer: 2

Comments to the Author

This is a very good and topical paper about resource nationalism and the law in Indonesia. It is very well researched, containing very detailed historical and political perspectives that one rarely reads in the literature. However, in my view it is still underdone, particularly from the perspective of language, which generated some confusion in several parts, and needed a thorough edit. I also found it difficult to discern a clear argument from the beginning. I also think there is very little utility in making recommendations as they appear in the conclusion. I would be happy to review a revised version of the paper once it has been 'tidied up' in line with these recommendations.
